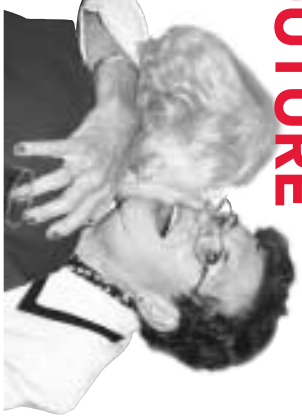

Olympic champion Billy Mills serves as Running Strong's national spokesperson, encouraging Native youth with his message based on character, dignity and pride. Billy is an Oglala Lakota Sioux born and raised on Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. Billy became the first and only American to win a gold medal in the 10,000 meters race in 1964 Tokyo Olympic Games. He set an Olympic record of 28 minutes 24.4 seconds. To this day Billy's accomplishment remains a great source of pride to Native American people. To date, no other American has won a gold medal in the 10,000 meters.
